Dear Catholic Brothers in Christ:

It has been several weeks since we enjoyed our 23rd Annual Men's Retreat with Dr. Tom Curran. The results of our survey indicate that everyone was unanimous in their feeling that they were helped in their spiritual journey, with 80% rating the retreat as excellent and 20% rating it as good, which are among the best ratings we have ever seen.

Consider the next steps in your life. Are you willing to enter into the transformation that Christ wants for you and your life? What are the next steps for living this new reality in your life? Write down three significant changes you are making to your life after this retreat. Consider writing your response in preparation for Advent.

We as the committee are ready to be of assistance in any way that we can in our individual efforts at continued spiritual growth. The most important action we can take is frequent reception of the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation. Because this is not a journey we should undertake alone, we would encourage you to form or join small groups of Catholic men to meet regularly, with prayer, scriptures, and sharing. Through these groups you can also help encourage brothers on their journey. Committee members are willing to assist you in joining or forming a group.

We thank you for completing the survey at the retreat. Your feedback and insights have been shared with our retreat committee, Pastors, and our retreat masters. Thank you for the affirmations and suggestions. They will be used to plan our 24th Annual Retreat. If you know of anyone financially able to help underwrite the retreat next year, please let us know. Our expenses next year for travel and hosting expenses of the Vatican-based Cardinal will be substantially higher than we have experienced in the past.

In planning for next year, please ask your parish to put the 2021 retreat on the planning calendar: October 8-10th with Raymond Cardinal Burke. Those men who attended our 2020 retreat and also submit a paid registration by the deadline to be announced will be guaranteed a seat to hear Cardinal Burke. Please wait to submit until we send you the new announcement.

As you look at your digital copy of the picture taken of the retreat group (below), it is always fun to look back and remember the men who shared this spiritual experience with you. We shall pray for one another as we share the journey – walking the faith in the Body of Christ.

Please read the letter below from Mike Casey, a follow-up to his discussion at our retreat on the topic of Parish Intercessory Prayer. It should be an important part of your path forward!

Dear Brothers;

"We humbly ask that you glorify your venerable servant, Fr. Michael J. McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will." How many tens of millions, hundreds of millions of times has our loving God heard this sentence from the prayer for Fr. McGivney's canonization? Asking only to fulfill God's holy will; requested humbly. No doubt, you, like I, have been saying this prayer of supplication for years. Now those prayers have been answered as our Venerable Founder becomes our Blessed Founder. The journey began December 18, 1997 when the Cause for Sainthood was opened in Hartford, Connecticut by Archbishop Daniel Cronin. Nearly five years later the official

document, the Positio, outlining the case for Fr. McGivney's cause was sent to Rome. On March 15, 2008 Fr. McGivney was declared "Venerable" indicating he lived a life of heroic virtue. This year on May 27, nearly twenty-three years after his cause was opened, Pope Francis authorized a decree that a miracle attributed to Fr. McGivney's intercession has been approved.

October 2020 will long be remembered as the month Fr. McGivney's beatification Mass was celebrated at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford. It is currently scheduled for October 31. This will be a time of great joy and happiness for all members of the Knights of Columbus.

Spotlighting our founder and his reasons for founding the Order; i.e., to strengthen men in their faith and to provide for the financial needs of families overwhelmed by illness or death of the breadwinner, this spotlight will draw more Catholic men to join with us. Our Order is an immense force for good in this world with the billions of dollars donated to worthy causes over the past decade, strengthening our fraternal bonds with acts of charity. The Knights of Columbus helps us husbands and fathers not only fortify our faith, but also provides an opportunity for us to protect our families. Is it significant that the approved miracle involved the son of one of our general agents from our insurance program?

I like to think so. When Patrick McGivney died unexpectedly, young Michael had to leave the seminary to help provide for his family. He and his family struggled through the loss of his father and then as the curate at St. Mary's he saw parishioners facing similar situations. He saw a need and he took action. He organized; he led, he inspired. He was concerned with both the spiritual and the temporal well-being of those around him.

Speaking of being a man of action, now is the time for you to take action: You will soon receive, if you have not yet already received it, the 2020 Fraternal Survey. It may be filled out in paper form or online. Whether on paper or online, please take a minute to complete it. It will be prefilled with much of your information to make it a snap to complete. It will provide information that will help me serve you better. There is a very informative insert included in the survey packet. Please take a minute to review that, too.

I consider it a worthy calling to carry on the work of our soon to be Blessed Founder. It's been my great pleasure to work with many of you to help you protect your family and I look forward to continuing to serve you. Please call me if you have any questions or concerns.

Thanks to you for all the good works you carry out in the name of the Order. Your acts of charity are even more critical considering this current pandemic. Thank you for all you do!

Special thanks to Grand Knight Jim Burkhardt of Post Falls Council 12560 along with the brother Knights and their families from councils 12560, 11623 and 1363 for leading a large distribution of about 1,000 coats, 435 stocking hats, 108 pairs of gloves and mittens, 68 sock sets, and 170 scarfs in northern Idaho on November 27. The work of all our councils in our state to continue to get coats for kids in need during these trying times is another example of the great things we do that make me proud to be a Knight.

As we move into the Advent and Christmas season, I encourage all our councils to continue to work on our Leave No Neighbor Behind Program. Let's try to do our best to reach out to all our members in our councils to find out how they are doing and if we can help them in any way. The need for food in our local communities also continues to be a need that I encourage our Knights of Columbus Councils to continue to help with. This past month, I met with the leadership of Wish Medical in Moscow and toured their facility. They provide care and support and Ultra Sounds for pregnancies and their Statement of Faith is in line with our Catholic teaching, so if your councils can donate funds for an ultrasound machine, we want to do our best to be able to put a new machine in their clinic next spring. We are also starting the process to see if we can provide funding support for an ultrasound machine for the Lifeline Pregnancy Care Center in Nampa.
