# Idaho Knights in Action

### Christmas Baskets – Twin Falls

On Saturday, December 18th Council 1416 distributed Food Baskets to 152 families with 591 family members. Each box contained cans of soups, fruits and vegetables, peanut butter, jam, bread, eggs, butter, oil, flour, sugar, milk, cheese, yogurt, potatoes, 2 cases of ramen and ham. The Cub Scouts made ornaments to give out with the baskets, and the Boy Scouts helped transport the boxes out to cars for pickup. The Council held a breakfast and solicited donations from parishioners. St. Edwards School held a food drive and collected some canned goods

included with the Baskets. The Thanksgiving Mass collection was donated by the Church to help with the baskets. Nearly \$10,000 dollars of food was given out with the Council spending around \$6,000 dollars of its own funds.

## **Early Detection - Pocatello**

Knights of Columbus Council 892 members present a check for \$7,000 to the Health West Pediatrics Clinic in Pocatello recently, to be used to purchase advanced hearing and vision diagnostic equipment. Doctors soon will be better able to detect hearing and vision problems in young children in southeastern Idaho, thanks to a \$7,000 donation from Council 892 of the Knights of Columbus.

The money will be used by Health West, Inc., a federally-funded health care center that provides pediatric primary, preventative and behavioral health care at its Pocatello clinic, to purchase two pieces of specialized diagnostic equipment. The first is "spot vision," which is designed to detect early visual impairments and six amblyopic risk factors in pediatric patients as young as six months. Often times, vision disorders have no noticeable symptoms, and as a result young children remain undiagnosed and untreated.

The "spot vision" device can capture results on 97 percent of pediatric patients with minimal cooperation, compared to only 19 percent accuracy rate when using chart-based screenings.

The OAE Hearing device, meanwhile, is designed to detect permanent congenital, delayed-onset, and/or progressive hearing loss in newborns, infants, toddlers, pre-school and school-age children, without incorporating responses from patients. When children have undiagnosed hearing loss, it can affect their speech, language, cognitive and social development. Being able to provide hearing screenings during childhood is vital for early detection, treatment and management of hearing loss to pediatric patients.

"On behalf of Health West, Dr. Greg Kostur, and our dedicated pediatrics team, we would like to express our gratitude to the Knights of Columbus for their continued support," said Melissa Myers, director of grants, budgeting and special programs for Health West. "Having the availability to use these diagnostic screening devices in our Pediatrics clinic is life changing. Not only will both technologies help our pediatricians and medical staff perform fast, accurate and objective vision and hearing screenings for young children, but using the right technology in our pediatric practice will help improve patients, outcomes and make a profound difference in the lives of our patients."

Mike Doellman, Grand Knight for Council 892, said the donation was first suggested by council member Jim Price who had conversations with the pediatric clinic about the value of early detection of hearing and vision problems. Being able to detect and treat those problems early in life can dramatically change the quality of life for the patients, Price was told, and he suggested the local KC council support the purchase of these diagnostic devices.

Much of the money was raised by the Knights' annual charity golf tournament, which generates money for a wide range of good causes each summer, including the most recent tournament held last September.

"The Knights are a life-affirming organization that is always looking for ways to improve the quality of life of those in our community, in particular the young people of our community," said Doellman.

Myers said she hopes to have the new diagnostic tools purchased, assembled and staff trained to use them by March of this year.

The Knights of Columbus is a fraternal group of Catholic men who use their time, talents and treasure to further educational, charitable, liturgical, youth and family works in their parish, community, state and nation.

### Coats for Kids – Twin Falls Council 1416

This year of Council 1416 Twin Falls member Mark Rasgorshek's son Drake helped Coordinate with the Knights of Columbus on our Coats for Kids program for his Senior Project. Drake helped secure 110 coats from JD Heiskell, and held a coat distribution in Wendell, Id on October 23, where 70 coats were distributed. A barrel was present in the church for coat donation from October through mid-December where 26 coats were collected. The remainder of the coats from the JD Heiskell, the coats donated at the church were added to the four boxes of coats Purchased by Council 1416 and matched by the state for a total of 162 coats given to Sr. Rosemarie Boessen at La Posada community outreach center in Twin Falls for distribution. A majority of these coats have been distributed to needy in the Magic Valley already.

## **Supreme Chaplain's Challenge**

February 2022

When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." (Gospel for Feb. 6, Lk 5:8-10)

Simon Peter recognizes Jesus for who he is and deems himself unworthy to be in his presence. Jesus, in calling the fisherman to follow him, tells him not to fear. Every one of us is a sinner, and yet Jesus calls each of us to follow him. It is not our own virtues or

qualifications, but rather Jesus who empowers us with his grace to respond to his invitation. Brothers, remember St. Paul's words: "I have the strength for everything through him who empowers me" (Phil 4:13).



This month, I challenge you to go to confession and attend at least one weekday Mass, offering it for the intention to fearlessly answer Christ's call to follow him. Second, I challenge you to participate in or consider starting the Faith in Action Into the Breach program.

#### **Questions for Reflection:**

Are you sometimes afraid to follow Christ more closely because you consider yourself too sinful and unworthy? Do you truly believe in and experience Christ's mercy and seek to forgive yourself as well as others? Do you stay close to the sacrament of penance in order to do battle with your own sinfulness and allow God's grace to strengthen you for spiritual combat?

### Mass for Life – Boise



Every new member MUST be recorded at supreme by close of business on March 31, 2022 to qualify!


#### MCGIVNEY2020
