Membership Report


March was another very good month in terms of membership growth. We brought in 13 new members however, there were 3 members that were dropped from our rosters and that would affect out net growth. As of March 26 2021, we are in the 50th spot in the orders overall standings and we brought in 105 total new members for the year. That puts us at 49.3% towards our goal of 213 and we need 108 new members to reach that goal. Please see the chart below for our yearly progress.

While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." (Gospel for March 28, Mk 14:22-24)

At the Last Supper, Jesus gave us the gift of himself in the Eucharist, our essential spiritual food and drink, which gives us the life of Christ. We live at a time when many Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist — the body, blood, soul and divinity of Christ under the appearances of bread and wine. May we, brother Knights, never forget the true nature of the Eucharist nor lose our desire to receive Christ in the sacrament of the altar.



Challenge: This month, I challenge you to spend 10 additional minutes before Mass each Sunday preparing to receive the Eucharist, as well as 10 minutes after Mass in thanksgiving for this gift. Dear Brother Knights,

Roy Bartholomay - Idaho State Deputy

Happy Easter and welcome to Spring! I want to welcome 13 new brother Knights into our order during March and thank all the councils for your continued good work around the State. I also want to thank you for stepping up to the challenge of helping out with the Bishop's "I will give half campaign" on such short notice to support Pro-Life causes. Earlier in March we heard from the Supreme Council that Moscow's Ultrasound request was approved by the Board of Directors so congratulations to Council 1397 for all their work to raise the funds to put the ultrasound into Wish Medical! Life is indeed alive in Idaho.

Lately I have been working with the Knights of Columbus in Pocatello to see if one of their local facilities (Health West) could fit under the Knights of Columbus rules for the Ultrasound Program. I had a very positive and supportive meeting with the Bishop and Diocese on the subject, and when I inquired with Supreme ultrasound leader Drew Dillingham, I was reminded about our key core principles behind the ultrasound program:

"While the efforts of the center to provide resources and care to at-risk women and the unborn are laudable (aside from its promotion of contraception), the Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Program Guidelines state that "policies regarding use and referral for contraception must not conflict with Catholic moral principles." In light of this policy, the center does not qualify for participation in the Ultrasound Program. I am sorry for any inconvenience this may cause any of the parties involved. I would be happy to help the councils involved to identify another pregnancy center in Idaho that would qualify for participation in the Ultrasound Program." If we have other places in the State considering supporting a pregnancy center, let's communicate a path forward to be successful.

Last month we reported that we were going to hold a 1-day convention on Saturday April 17 at the Red Lion Downtowner Hotel in Boise. Since, we have been able to open it up for 75 in person attendance. The convention will also be holding a blended (virtual and in-person) voting session for 90 minutes on some of the key business items we need to take care of for business for the State. That session will be similar to last years' convention and will have a Supreme guest present. As soon as we get the firm time for that session, we will be finalizing the agenda along with the virtual call-in information.
