



KNIGHT OF THE YEAR: JIM JENSEN

Fruitland Council 12516 would like to nominate Sir Knight Jim Jensen as Knight of the Year. Jim passed this last fall but we are asking this be awarded posthumously.

When Jim Jensen married Vea Rabourn Black in 2010 after completing RCIA, already knowing he had been active in his previous faith, his computer user group and the Orchid Society, the council made sure he was invited to become a Knight. He accepted the invitation as he was hungry to do things in his new faith. The earliest 1st degree was at Risen Christ which worked well for him as he was still working for the Postal Service in Kuna. He met me there with a big smile and the rest is pretty much history!



In his first year as a Knight, Jim acquired his second, third and then fourth degrees, becoming a very proud Sir Knight. He served 26 terms in council, assembly and district positions including GK, Treasurer and Faithful Navigator and District Deputy (as well as two years as District Warden) 16 annual program positions, numerous silver rose hand-offs, incoming and outgoing and was always available for pictures with the youth and would beam at answering their questions about the Knights of Columbus. When the regalia was retired and the 4th transitioned to the current uniform, he was quick tofollow as he didn't want to miss any opportunities to represent the Order. He would go to great lengths to ensure that Sir Knights in Ontario and Western Idaho had representation at their funerals, even if he may be the only one there. He would also travel much of southern Idaho to do the same for others. The respect for his dedication to the 4th and the Honor Guards was obvious at his funeral by the tremendous turnout of other Sir Knights and 3rd Degree Knights at his services.

But Jim was dedicated to serving the local church and community as well. In his 11 years as a Knight, he served full time in the choir, most of the time a cantor as well and was a Eucharistic Minister. Anytime the church office folks needed help, they knew they could count on Jim so he and his sidekick Dee would move furniture, tables or whatever was needed. During the exodus of the parish hall at Payette they helped move items to storage. Then when the temporary parish offices had to be vacated they moved everything off site, then when we moved into the new office space, guess who got the call Jim.

Outside of his obvious help at the church, he also managed the food pantry for the K of C. This entailed purchasing the products needed for us to help Payette County residents with emergency food products. He kept the food pantry inventory at a level that let us service the community. He also went out of his way to help the volunteers who distributed the food in any way he could! This eventually led to another ministry of the Knights through distribution of food from a corporate partner. Several days a week, sometimes up to 7, he would go and pick up food at 8am, stock the food pantry at our church, fill overstock freezers with frozen meat and distribute to needy families who may not solicit the food pantry. He also shared this bounty with other Catholic food pantries and senior citizen centers. This program saved our food pantry thousands of dollars a year as well as the neighboring ones.



Jim also started a medical equipment program to help folks in need. He built an additional storage on his property dedicated to this program, and advertised it well. He had families from a 4 county area that benefited. He often would pickup and deliver when the families had no means to transport the equipment. When the Meridian program shut down he added much of that inventory to our own, growing the help to families in both Idaho and Oregon. I have received many compliments from people we didn't know, from parishioners, other parishes and other friends out of the blue. He touched many lives in many ways.

It is bittersweet that we submit this application, and we ask that you prayerfully consider deceased Sir Knight Jim Jensen as Knight of the Year.

Idaho State Jurisdiction Knights of Columbus

Family of the Year 2021-2022

Warren Holcomb (#2305780) is a knight in good standing in the Knights of Columbus. He currently serves St. Pius X Council 11623 in Coeur d'Alene as Outside Guard. He has 40 years of continued service with the Knights of Columbus. Warren and his wife Theresa are exemplary members of our parish and are deserving of this award.

Together they are committed to their faith and although all their children are adults with families of their own, Warren and Theresa continue to be instrumental in ensuring that their faith continues to be an integral part of the lives of their children and grandchildren. Every weekend you will see three generations of Holcombs present together at Mass.

Warren is active within our council and helps out at most events. Together, they coordinated an appreciation dinner the council held to honor our wives for the support they give up. Every 6 weeks our council is asked to host a soup kitchen at the parish for those who would otherwise go hungry. Warren and Theresa have hosted the soup kitchen twice in the last year. This involves preparing food and directing volunteers in serving that food to the needy. They helped coordinate our council's participation in a local multi-parish picnic held this last summer at Holy Family Catholic School. In excess of 20 members of our council participated and more than 500 people attended that event. Our council's biggest fundraiser is selling food from a booth at the local county fair. At the last Fair Warren worked 4 six hour shifts and Theresa worked two shifts.

Warren is a Eucharistic Minister at St. Pius X Catholic Church and Theresa in a Lector.

Theresa is responsible for hospitality at the weekly Exploring Catholicism class at St. Pius. In this capacity Theresa and another person make sure that there are refreshments for the attendees. Exploring Catholicism usually has at least 60 – 90 people in attendance.

Theresa is also a member of the Pius Angels. This group is on call to the church to assist as needed by the church at a variety of things. When needed, Warren is also there to assist.

Father Roger LaChance a former Priest at St. Pius X used to say, "Evangelize always. When needed use words." Warren and Theresa live their live this way and are always there for the parish and the council and always lead by example and always live their faith.

In preparing this nomination I talked to St. Pius X Deacon Chris Stewart about the Holcombs and about the man we are presenting as our nominee for Knight of the Year (Tom Tintinger). During that conversation, Deacon Chris said the following, "Tom and the Holcombs are always there when the church needs them and they all approach their service with joyful participation".

I hope you will consider honoring Warren and Theresa Holcomb as the Knights of Columbus Family of the Year in Idaho for 2021 – 2022.

When the Silver Rose is in Mountain Home Father includes the Silver Rose ceremony in mass. Father is also the Chair on the Catholic Charities of Idaho Board of Directors. FAMILY ACTIVITIES OF THE YEAR

Behind every good Knight is an even better wife and family. It is easy to overlook the sacrifices that families of Knights make when their husbands and dads are away participating in Council activities. Therefore, Council 12560 sponsors two annual events just for family members. Those activities are our annual Summer Barbeque and our Spouse Appreciation Banquet

Summer Party

Typically held during July of each year, Council 12560 organizes a get together for our Knights and their family members. For the past few years, we have held this event at the 7B Ranch located just west of Post Falls. The ranch is owned by former Grand Knight Don Beck. The Council provides the burgers, brats, chips and beverages. Partygoers bring a potluck dish suitable for a summer picnic, chairs and sunscreen. This year, over 80 people participated in the event. This event has become famous for its comhole tournament. Several comhole boards are placed outside. Multiple teams of two compete. To enhance the competition, the Council offers to comp the annual dues of the winning team. This year, former Grand Knight John Webber and Ken Schake won the tournament.

Spouse Appreciation Banquet

In November, for the first time ever, Council 12560 organized a Spouse Appreciation Banquet. We wined and dines the ladies as the Knights stayed home and watched the kiddos. Participants were encouraged to attend a Saturday Vigil Mass. After Mass, the Knights reserved the church social hall for the event. After Mass, the ladies wandered into the social hall where they were met by Knights wearing tuxedos, taken by the arm and led to their tables. One of our parishioners that specializes in decorating banquet halls assisted our Council in decorating the hall and tables with an array of flowers, plants and candles.

Council 12560 is fortunate to have several excellent cooks within our group including some that were professional chefs and former owners of restaurants. A five-course meal was prepared to include assorted wines, dinner salad, antipasto, minestrone soup, garlie bread sticks, homemade lasangua (meat, veggie and gluten free), cheese ravioli and gelato.

As the ladies dined, they were entertained by a musician playing soft, Italian-themed guitar music. Fun was had by all. We fed 72 spouses. The feedback was both positive and genuine. Now, it will be difficult for the Council not to have this event each year.

Faith Award

Vagabond Ministries confront a cycle of neglect, violence and broken family life. Vagabond Missions introduces them to Jesus and a loving community by mobilizing missionaries. Through outreach, every inner-city teen can be known, loved and experience hope for their lives. We invite inner-city and urban teens into a relationship with Jesus Christ and His Church, through contact work, discipleship and solidarity with the poor. Our council raises money to help support the efforts of Gustavo who works full time with this ministry. Not only does the council participate and donate but individual council members and families donate to the good work of Vagabond and Gustavo.

At risk youth are the focus. Teens in the inner-city face a cycle of neglect, violence and broken family life. This destructive environment has dire consequences for them and society. Vagabond Missions intervenes during this time of crisis by inviting them into a relationship with God and others. Through outreach and mentorship, teens experience hope for their lives and a place to call home. When teens tangibly experience Jesus, lives are transformed. Caldwell parishioner Gustavo Gomez works with the inner-city youth of Wichita, KS. In Wichita, KS the council sponsors Gustvo Gomez of OLV. Gustavo is a partner with the local diocese and a local church. Often these parishes are the home of our Urban Underground. They take kids to Mass weekly and coordinate RCIA with the local parish. By doing these activities, Gustavo and his co-ministers help get at risk kids off the streets, out of gangs and help them build a relationship with Jesus Christ through the Gospel.

Gustavo's father Hector is a member of council 3086. Hector and Gustavo approached the council about the good work of Vagabond Ministries and the assistance that Gustavo needs in order to carry out his mission. Support for Gustavo has been ongoing and will continue in the near future. The council is also considering supporting others that have been called to this ministry by God.

Publicity Award

Our need was to improve communication. Our monthly newsletter allows Knights who cannot attend Council meetings to keep up. Our parish web page allows parishioners to find out more about us and to contact us. Our Facebook page allows us to post pictures with captions and current activities. If a group that we are working shares our post, that can dramatically increase the number of people who see the post. Using the parish's Flocknotes email and text system instead of having emails come from individual Knights computers is a better practice. An individual's computer can crash and leave the Council without a way to communicate. Both the GK and FS can email or text using Flocknotes. The real-time, multi-user capability of online Google spreadsheets allowed our Council and the St. Thomas Council to jointly fill 199 schedule slots for our main fundraiser, the North Idaho State Fair Food Booth.

In spite of all the challenges we have faced during the pandemic, and with all 40 of our active councils reporting in record time, I am very proud to report that the Knights of Idaho donated almost \$370,000 to our charitable causes of Faith, Family, Life, and Community this past year and almost 117,000 hours of labor. With work efforts like this, I can honestly say that the future of the Idaho Knights of Columbus continues to be very bright!

Our thoughts and prayers always remain with Pope Francis who is a tremendous supporter of the Knights of Columbus, world-wide. Our thoughts and prayers also remain with our brother Knights and families in Ukraine along with other families affected worldwide by war.

The State Council is thankful for the leadership and spiritual guidance of Bishop Peter Christensen. We appreciate his support of the Knights in Idaho, and his leadership within the Diocese of Boise. We stand **always** in "Solidarity with our Bishops and Priests" in Idaho. We renew our pledge to be their right arm as the lay leaders that the Church so badly needs and that our founder, **Parish Priest** and Blessed Fr. Michael J. McGivney envisioned when he conceived this organization 140 years ago.

We are also very grateful for the continuing commitment and spiritual leadership of our State Chaplain Father John Kucera. Fr. Kucera sacrifices much of his time to serve as spiritual advisor at our State meetings as well as here at the Convention. This year, Father once again led a Spiritual retreat for the State Officers that followed his previous years retreat with more lessons from the Father Kapaun spiritual series. He also led us in three prayer hours at our state meetings. May God bless you, Fr. Kucera, for your service.

I express my sincere appreciation and heartfelt thanks to the State Officers, District Deputies, Directors and Chairmen who contribute to the goals of the State Council. All the successes that we have enjoyed this past year are a direct result of their dedication, perseverance, and communication. My duties have been lightened by your strong support. In addition, we cannot accomplish anything without the support and dedication of local Council officers and members. Our work is for you and our successes are from you. Thank you all for the great work you are doing!

I need to thank my wife Darcy and my children, for their continued help and support of me. My thanks to all the wives and families of all my brother Knights for their continual support of us and our Order. It is only through the generosity of our families that we can dedicate the time and energy to serve others. Without our families, much of what we do, would not matter.

I would like to offer a special thanks to Chuck Davlin, our Regional Growth Director. He has been a tremendous asset and has been a great mentor for these past 2 years. The State Council is blessed to have had him assigned to us.

Worthy delegates, you have been chosen by your Councils to represent your Council's membership at this convention. Please take this responsibility seriously. Your vote during the elections, resolutions process and other business decisions obligates your Council to abide by the decisions made at this meeting.

We are continually asking you to invite another Catholic man to join in our charitable efforts. Why is it important that we GROW THE ORDER? We have to recruit every day of the fraternal year, because it IS IMPORTANT. If we are not growing, then we are dying like so many other

organizations. It is through Council growth that we recharge our Councils with more hands to share the load and replace some of the hard workers that have done all they can do

On every Council roster, there are Knights who have decided not to participate in our charitable works or who we cannot even contact. This year Supreme introduced the affiliate program to help move those brother knights off the council roles so councils can spend more time doing their works of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. We can all do a better job of keeping all of our members involved in our activities, mentoring them and keeping in touch with them. As part of the ongoing activities in your Council, you must talk to these men to maintain their inclusion in your Council. Make a TRUE effort to retain members. The Retention Committee's work starts when a new member is brought in by finding out what activities interest him and how he can help the Council. We can retain him by keeping him interested in what we do.

As of April 16, our state membership stands at 5,092 members. So far this year, we have recruited 161 new members. We have reached 69% of our state membership goal. However, we are 80% of the way through our fraternal year. In order to achieve our statewide goal by June 30, we need to get serious about inviting other Catholic men to join with us. Membership has been picking up as more people are coming back to masses and we still have the opportunity to offer free online membership and can still offer this to any eligible Catholic man we meet for the rest of this Fraternal year by asking them to go to KofC.org/joinus. I challenge everyone in this room to recruit just one more guy. We must actively offer our Order and the good works we do, to every eligible Catholic man and his family. Help them become better men, Catholics, fathers and husbands, by joining their efforts with ours.

Thank you to all Councils that have recruited this year. To those that have not; join the rest of us and help us to build the order!

NEW COUNCIL DEVELOPMENT AND REACTIVATION

We have really tried to establish new councils this year in McCall and Jerome recruiting several members into the McCall roundtable and Recruiting 5 new Hispanic members in Jerome, but in neither location have we been able to find the leadership to have them start a council. Our Hispanic Development coordinator Cruz Estefes has brought in a few new members in Mountain Home to try to reactivate their Hispanic Council, but again we cannot get our brother Knights to step up to the leadership roles, so are working to create a roundtable under Mountain Home Council 3703. Also, a special thank you to Pona Magano, our Hispanic Growth Coordinator from Supreme. He has traveled to Idaho several times to help us with training for council 12953 and helped with recruitment weekends in Jerome and St. Anthony, Rexburg, and Driggs.

ROUND TABLES

I remind all District Deputies and Grand Knights that each Round Table ceases to exist on July 1st and so a new Round Table Form must be submitted for a round-table to continue. Having a round table fulfills Fr. McGivney's dream of having a Knights of Columbus presence in every parish. A Round Table contains the spirit and the energy of the Knights in a visible, active and focused forum even if it never grows into a full council, it is one more step in the realization of Fr. McGivney's dream. This year we have worked with the Mountain Home council and Fruitland councils to establish Hispanic round tables in their councils. Our College round table at University of Idaho has continued to be a great success under the leadership of David Gonzalez and other brother Knights in

our Moscow 1397 council. Recently had a very successful recruitment weekend for our college council Round Table at Idaho State University bringing in 4 new members.

STATE COUNCIL ACCOUNT BALANCES

Whenever requested, the State Treasurer and Secretary have provided updated reports of all accounts. I look the accounts over on a regular basis. I can attest that all accounts remain strong and are solvent. State Secretary George Mesina and State Treasurer Dan Moberg are to be commended for their diligence to good accounting principles during this fiscal year. We utilize an independent outside auditor to review our books, to protect both the State membership and the State officers.

INSURANCE

Kevin Tuuri is our General Agent. He has several agents working with him to cover all of Idaho. There are no Councils that do not have an assigned agent. Kevin has been very responsive to any questions or requests we have asked of him. With the new requirements for the Founders award, three order-wide insurance promotion nights one dealing with long-term care, one with Van Mueller, and one about careers as an agent were offered to all brother knights and fellow catholic parishioners' virtually. Kevin and his team have also offered local events when requested. We still have two more opportunities for Insurance promotion presentations by workld renown speaker Ed Slott on May 26 and June 23. There has been the opportunity for every council to earn the Founders award this year. Kevin is committed to the success of his agents and to help the councils and members with their insurance needs.

Please take every opportunity to welcome, invite and utilize these valuable assets. As always, these dedicated professionals don't just sell insurance, they sell the Knights of Columbus and our Faith. Our insurance we purchase is what allows the Knights of Columbus to donate money world-wide to help causes, so when a knight buys insurance we are aiding in charitable giving. Their goal is to give as many Catholic families as possible a chance to fully participate and enjoy all of the benefits that come with membership in our Order. Do your part to provide these benefits of membership to all of the members of your Councils by actively promoting and using the Agency Staff here in Idaho. Remember that these agents are brother Knights trying to earn a living for their family, so please take every opportunity to meet with them.

FOURTH DEGREE

We are also blessed by the service of our District Master, Sir Knight Dave Ellingsen. Dave has been a vital part of the Idaho Knights of Columbus for many years and we are look forward to continuing to work with him as the District Master.

CEREMONIALS

The new Combined Ceremony of the First, Second, and Third Degree, is being used and is a great tool to bring new Knights up to the Third degree. Ken Reif, our ceremonial chairman has done well with holding live ceremonies in the Treasure valley and several councils in other parts of the state now have teams to perform the ceremony. There is no better way to invite a new knight into our order than through a well-done live ceremony, and we continue to encourage all our councils to form a team and hold in-person ceremonies as your local churches will allow under the pandemic. The video has also been used extensively to help promote social distancing, and our state has done really well with reaching out to our new online members and inviting them to degrees and getting them into their councils.

VOCATIONS

This last year was another successful one in the support of vocations by the Idaho Knights of Columbus with over \$17,000 council funds given to the RSVP program. Do not forget that support is not just money. Seminarians should receive cards, letters, invitations to Council events and visits from members. If your Council is not supporting a Seminarian, I urge you to do so and help with the development and growth of Vocations.

FOOD FOR FAMILIES/LEAVE NO NEIGHBOR BEHIND

Our State has done extremely well with our support for the Leave No Neighbor Behind Program. Many of our councils have set up calling trees to check up on their brother Knights and reached out to their priests to offer help and support for their parishes. The food for families' program has been one of our primary contribution programs in the state this year. Council's donated over \$19,700 and 7,300 hours of service to their local food banks.

COATS FOR KIDS

I am extremely proud of Idaho's accomplishments with the Coats for Kids program. About ¾ of our Councils participate in this program to help put coats on kids in need. This past year councils in this State purchased over \$13,000 in coats and did large distributions in Grangeville, Coeur d' Alene, McCall, Pocatello and Twin Falls delivering thousands of coats to kids in need. Each year Supreme offers to match any box purchased as long as your council submits a plan for your local distribution. This past year we received over 40 matching boxes from Supreme to distribute. I encourage all our councils to consider even purchasing one box from Supreme and getting a box matched to help support your local causes and continue to request donations for gently used coats from your local parishes, which many councils already do as part of their Coats for kids' program.

GLOBAL WHEELCHAIR MISSION

The pandemic certainly slowed down our opportunity to host Wheelchair Sunday's, but some our councils still were able to provide some funds to this important program. Wheelchair Sundays are easy to plan and help accomplish, so please remember to consider this as something we can do to provide the gift of mobility to those in need.

CULTURE OF LIFE

I have the honor to announce that Council 1363 and other councils in the state were able to raise the funds and do the paperwork for matching funds from Supreme to purchase 2 new ultrasound machines for their Open Arms Center this year. Lewiston Council 1024 along with help from other councils in the State raised the funds and did the paperwork for matching funds from Supreme to purchase an ultrasound machine for the Reliance Center. As a State, councils donated over \$86,300 for life activities along with many service hours. Idaho Knights also participated in Marches for Life in Idaho Falls, Boise, Lewiston, Moscow, and Coeur d'Alene and our State legislature passed a bill to ban abortions after 6 weeks of life. I am proud to say Idaho is truly a supporter of life at all stages!

REPORTS

To preserve our tax-exempt status as an international organization, your Council has to report charitable hours through the Fraternal Activity report. The government would love to get their hands on our

charitable funds; it is up to each of you to help protect our status as a non-profit organization by reporting your service activities.

The Colombian Award Report is the vehicle to report activities to Supreme and be recognized for service in our Parishes and communities. It is important that we recognize our members who do so much charitable work.

PENNIES FROM HEAVEN

The Pennies from Heaven Fund continues to help those in need. Last year many Councils helped to support this cause. Thank you all. Please contribute again this year so we can continue to help those who need it most. I encourage you do a fundraiser for the person in need as well as make a PFH request so that we can be of even more help to them when the cause is needed.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS

Once again, the State Council is partnering with Special Olympics of Idaho. This past year the state went to online raffle tickets and many local Knights purchased raffle tickets. Our council activities help get funds from the Supreme council and once again we will donate the check received to Idaho Special Olympics.

SUMMARY

This has truly been a roller coaster of a year with all the challenges but has also been an Experience of a Lifetime, I have been blessed to have been elected into an Officers role and have the opportunity to work with all of you. I have met a lot of wonderful people during my travels and am impressed with the activity and dedication within the Councils that I have visited.

I urge you to use your membership to grow spiritually and grow personally. Singlehandedly you cannot affect as many lives as you can within a group of great men that are there to help and foster change. Take ownership of your roles, you have accepted the role that your council elected you to do. Make the most of it by achieving the goals set before you. We still have 10 weeks to make a difference in Idaho.

Thank you, members and delegates, for your prayers and support, I have tried to help and lead you, but ultimately, it is YOUR actions that guide our jurisdiction. I have been lucky to be able to visit with more than ¾ of the councils throughout our great State and have loved every minute of my experiences.
