Pro Life - Holy Spirit Council 11548, Meridian

Pro-Life activities ramped up again by Holy Spirit Council #11548 with the dropping of some COVID-19 restrictions at Holy Apostles in Meridian. The very successful fill the Baby Bottle Fundraiser kicked off May 22nd when the church approved handing out bottles after taking a year off. All proceeds are sent to local Right-to-Life organizations (Stanton Healthcare, Birth Rite, Life Line in Nampa and PATH) plus the Idaho Diaper bank. Further, after holding very successful Lent Fish Dinners and Cinnamon Roll fundraisers during the Covid-19 shut down of social events at church, the Council voted to donate \$7,000 to those same charities to make up for not having the Baby Bottle event in 2020. Chairperson of the Fish Dinners, Brother Tom Sorge, with the help of Brother Dave Innerbichler, created a link for parish members to order their fish dinner during lent. Parish members selected from a menu on the Council web site that allowed for pick up after Stations of the Cross. Brother Dennis Kuntz, chairperson of the Pancake Breakfast Fundraiser changed to cinnamon rolls that were sold in to go tins in the courtyard. Both fundraisers exceeded all expectations and allowed

the Knights to work with smaller work crews and meet church requirements for social distancing.


LETTER OF APPRECIATION AND GRATITUDE


MEMBERSHIP REPORT


Many councils need only a few new members to reach their quota for the fraternal year and time is quickly running out. I encourage everyone to keep recruiting new member.

Silver Rose Pilgrimage

The Knights of Columbus annual Silver Rose Pilgrimage, which honors Our Lady of Guadalupe and includes special services promoting the sanctity of life, will begin to reach Idaho councils on June 14, and will continue through July 11. Each Knights of Columbus council will work with local pastors and parish organizations to hold special prayer services featuring the Silver Rose in their respective areas.

In 1960, a group of Columbian Squires in Mexico, Canada and the United States decided to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe by carrying a rose across North American from Canada to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson addressed the effort in culture of life terms, referring to the Our Lady of Guadalupe – One Life, One Rose Program. He urged that it be expanded to every North American jurisdiction.

The number of Silver Roses that make the pilgrimage has increased over the years, to a total of 8 now making their way through North America. K of C councils along the way make arrangements to pick up the rose from the preceding councils.

"Originally when they started this, it was just the Mexican Knights who did it," said Dave Palumbo, the Silver Rose Chairman for the Idaho Knights of Columbus. "They ran a real rose from a northern border town down. The rose deteriorated over time, of course, and when they wanted to do it again, a silver smith in Mexico City made one. As the pilgrimage expanded, it was obvious they needed more."

Idaho Knights will receive the Silver Rose from the Pullman, Wash. Council on June 14. Services will be conducted in Moscow June 15, and then the Silver Rose will continue its journey through the state until it concludes in Fruitland July 11. Below is a calendar showing when the Silver Rose will be in the various councils throughout the state. Please contact your local Knights or parish office for times and locations of specific services associated with the Silver Rose.

Palumbo, who has been coordinating the Silver Rose Pilgrimage in Idaho for several years, begins working on the project early each year, after he receives word from the national Knights of Columbus office on when the Silver Rose will arrive in Idaho and how long it will stay in the state. He begins sending out emails to all the K of C Councils in the state asking for points of contact in each area to coordinate picking up the Silver Rose, and arranging local services. He begins putting together a tentative schedule as he hears back from the various councils, and it remains a "work in progress" right up until the Silver Rose is scheduled to arrive in Idaho.

The Silver Rose Pilgrimage originated in Mexico, and devotion to the Virgin of Guadalupe plays a major part in many parishes with large Hispanic populations. The Silver Rose offers a bridge between the Knights of Columbus and the broad parish community. The Silver Rose Ceremony is a parish prayer service (usually including a rosary) with a special emphasis on the relation of Mary to human life.

In Idaho, some K of C councils and parishes, especially those with large Hispanic membership, make the arrival of the Silver Rose a special occasion and include it as part of Masses. "Fruitland does the whole weekend," said Palumbo. "The theme of the Mass incudes a lot of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Silver Rose is prominently displayed, and they'll get 500 people who participate."

Dear Brother Knight:

The next Exemplification of the Fourth Degree is scheduled for Saturday, June 19, 2021 in Boise. Everything is being readied and the Sir Knights of De Smet Assembly are looking forward to hosting this event, having you participate, and becoming a Sir Knight attaining the highest degree of the Order ... the **Patriotic Degree**.

QUALIFICATIONS:

You must be Third Degree members in good standing as verified by your Council's Financial Secretary. A scanned Form 4 needs to be filled out completely and emailed to District Master David Ellingsen as soon as possible (address below). The original Form 4 must be mailed to the District Master a week in advance or brought to the exemplification for registration. Make sure that Form 4 is filled out properly with Council Financial Secretary statement of good standing, Candidate, Proposer, FN and FC signatures on appropriate lines. The Form 4 should be accompanied with the appropriate cost made payable to "David Ellingsen, District Master". It should be forwarded to me by the due date of June 14, 2021 or contact me about pending applicants so their names can be included in the program. Make sure the <u>candidate membership number</u> and <u>all (five) required signatures</u> are included on the Form 4.

COSTS:

The exemplification fee is \$50. The fee covers a Fourth-Degree pin, social baldric, and the Exemplification fee paid to Supreme. This is the Total fee for online exemplification. The Total fee for in-person is \$70 and covers the exemplification fee as well as the candidate's meal and a portion of the team's meal. It does **NOT** cover the candidate's wife or other guest tickets. Additional banquet tickets are available at \$15.00 each for wives, family members, or guests with an RSVP and pre-payment by June 14, 2021. <u>Without an RSVP and pre-payment, additional tickets are \$20.00 at the door</u>. The check for the additional dinners at should be made out to "<u>De Smet Assembly</u>". The \$50 online, or \$70.00 in person check is made payable to "<u>David Ellingsen, District Master</u>". Please confirm your head count so the Assembly can prepare properly for the Exemplification and Banquet. All checks may be mailed to District Master David Ellingsen before June 14th. Checks or Cash may be accepted from in-person candidate during registration provided proper candidate registration made by June 14th.

DRESS:

The desired dress for a candidate is black or dark suit (blue or gray business suit with black shoes, white dress shirt (plain front, no French cuffs, or button-down collars) and tie. If the candidate is a member of the military, a full-time police or firefighter, then a Class A or dress uniform may be worn. Fourth Degree members there to observe must be in dark business suit, tuxedo, or the new uniform. PLEASE, no blue jeans or cowboy boots will be permitted. Online candidates should follow the dress code as well.

SCHEDULE:

12:00 Noon - 1:00 P.M. – Registration of in person candidates ... Sacred Heart Catholic Church, Hope Hall (basement)

1:15 - 1:30P.M (MDT) (Note 12:15-12:30P.M. Pacific Daylight Time for those joining online from that time zone.)

1:30-4:00 P.M. – Degree work

4:00 – 5:00 P.M. – Clean up and picture taking (posed Knighting, group photo, etc.)

5:00 - 6:00 P.M. - Mass at Sacred Heart Catholic Church

6:00 – 9:00 P.M. – Social and Banquet Program, Sacred Heart Church, Hope Hall (basement)

<u>VERY IMPORTANT</u>: We must have a firm head count for the banquet including candidates, member observers, wives, and guests. Therefore, we need the number of people coming <u>No later than June 14, 2021</u>. Wives are not permitted to watch the Fourth Degree Ceremony at this time, and a wife's program has not been planned, so plan accordingly. Wives are invited to attend Mass with our Group and attend the Banquet Dinner following the degree. A manthly rolloction and practical challenge from Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. ... This is my commandment: Love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." (Gospel for May 9, Jn 15:9-10, 12-13)

Christ tells us we will remain in his love if we keep his commandments. Saying you love someone can be easy, but it is really our deeds that reveal our love — or lack of it. Christ showed us how to love by his example and by sacrificing his very life for us. To love as Christ commands us to love demands action. The Letter of James says, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves" (1:22). May each of us commit to keeping the commandments and offering our very selves in service and sacrifice for others.



Challenge: This month, I challenge you to meditate on the meaning of the Ten Commandments in your life by picking a different one on 10 different days and praying about it for at least 10 minutes.
