Worthy Brothers,

Now that Roe vs. Wade has fallen, the fight against abortion has moved to the individual states. An array of organizations that promulgate abortion will challenge pro-life laws. In fact, on August 2, the US Department of Justice sued Idaho over its abortion prevention law, the very first such lawsuit filed. Meanwhile, Oregon is building a Planned Parenthood clinic just across Idaho's border in Ontario Oregon, intended to provide abortions to women in a 200-mile radius; this includes more than half of Idaho's population. Idaho is being attacked.

Abortion destroys innocent human life and therefore violates God's commandment against murder. It is said that all it takes for evil to succeed is for enough good me to do nothing.

We Knights of Columbus are called to step into the breach in our culture of life and take a stand against this. We can help the citizens of Ontario, 75% of whom do not want the clinic, by joining the peaceful protest planned for on August 27. Supreme has placed over 1500 ultrasound machines and we can add our voices to those of the Oregon Knights in requesting one in Ontario; for we know that 9 of 10 women that see their baby alive in their womb will not have an abortion. For our state, we can support the Catholic Church's efforts to help Idaho against the federal lawsuit. And through prayer, let us seek divine inspiration for new ways we can help. Brothers, we can make a difference!

It will be nice to see the Knights gathering once again and I really look forward to seeing our Fourth Degree Knights in Regalia. I hope you and your families take advantage of the opportunity to tune in and watch.

Off to a Good Start:

The first form turned in for the new Fraternal year is the Report of Assembly Officers Chosen for the Term using Form 186 or it is preferred to use the online method to submit your officers. If not using the online method, please scan in your report and email to membershiprecords@kofc.org. Remember that even if the assembly has the same officers, this form must get submitted to Membership Records.

- Please be sure to include copies to your State Deputy, District Master and Vice Supreme Master.
- As stated, this form is preferred to be submitted through Member Management and the online method.
- Adding to Form confusion, at the bottom of this form it states “This form is intended for submission through regular mail.” It also states to E-MAIL – membershiprecords@kofc.org so what should you do? Please email the completed form.

The Annual Assembly Audit Report utilizing Form 1315 is the second form of the new fraternal year to get turned in to Supreme. By turning in the Audit Form a couple things are assured. The bond on your Comptroller is retained and later in the year when the Assembly is submitting forms for Star Assembly, you can check off that one box regarding Audit completed.

- Please be sure to include copies to your District Master and Vice Supreme Master.
- Even though the form states to mail original to Supreme Master, he has big helper to manage all this paperwork so please email the Audit Form to the Supreme Master’s Executive Administrative Assistant, Justyna Padilla (Justyna.Padilla@Kofc.Org).

Have you found a Patriotic Day to celebrate?

- The Coast Guard’s official history began on 4 August 1790 when President George Washington signed the Tariff Act that authorized the construction of ten vessels, referred to as “cutters,” to enforce federal tariff and trade laws and to prevent smuggling.
- If there is a Catholic School near you, consider asking if the Fourth Degree can “Raise Their Flag” on the first day of school.

The next Exemplification in your District is just around the corner. Ensure that you ask when and where they are occurring so you can plan ahead. Then ask someone if they are familiar with the Fourth Degree, Patriotic Order of the Knights of Columbus and offer to attend the Exemplification with them. It is a start.

COMMUNITY DIRECTOR REPORT

Brother Knights,

Coats for Kids Update

The question I was mostly asked during the Summer Meeting, “Is Supreme going to have another Coats for Kids matching program like last year?” THE ANSWER: No and yes. Let me explain.

Supreme is NOT DOING a Council Coats for Kids matching program like last year. But they are DOING a 1 to 1 matching program for State Councils for what Supreme is calling a Black Friday (Nov 25) distribution. This offer only exists for the Idaho State Council and NOT INDIVIDUAL COUNCILS. To participate in the matching program, councils must provide funds to the State Council for ordering and purchasing coats through Knights Gear. Supreme will then match the order 1 to 1 to the State Council and the ordered coats will only be sent to three – or four locations within the state. The box of coats cost the same as last year.

The WSD Mesina is thinking that possible locations might be Twin Falls, Idaho Falls, Coeur d Alene, Treasure Valley, and maybe somewhere in the District 7-8-9 area. Councils wishing to participate will provide the required information to the District Deputy. The DD will then consolidate the requests and submit them to the State Community Director to consolidate the State proposal for the WSD to meet an October 5 deadline to Supreme.

COUNCIL ACTION REQUIRED: Choose to participate or not. Each council please notify your District Deputy immediately (but no later than Sep 10) by phone/ text/ message the council decision – No or Yes about your decision to participate. Councils who do not want to participate in the matching program are encouraged buy or find used suitable coats for kids distributions. For those of you participating, details about submission requirements were sent out via email to GKs, FSs, and DDs before this newsletter was published. SILVER ROSE SERVICE **Holy Spirit Council 11548**



The journey of the silver rose begins each year in March and ends on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. During that time, Silver Roses travel from town to town along eight routes throughout North America. Several of those routes begin in Canada and end in Mexico.

The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose – a real, live one – was blessed by a bishop in Ontario. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. To better ensure future annual trips, a silver rose was ultimately made. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight silver roses travel unique routes.

On Thursday, June 30th at 7:00pm Holy Spirit Council #11548, Meridian, ID hosted the Silver Rose and held a Rosary/Prayer Service which was conducted exclusively by the Knights with Deacon David Shackley serving as the celebrant. Attendance was estimated at 60-70 people. In addition to Knights and their wives, the service was attended by members of The Legion of Mary, Blue Hats and two other local councils. DGK Steven Monte' began the evening by greeting attendees and delivering a brief history of the Silver Rose. Sir Knight Steve Gaston followed with the introduction and a short story on Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The processional had the Silver Rose escorted to the front of the altar by the Bishop Sylvester Treiner Assembly #2751 Color Guard led by Commander Joe Cordona. The Silver Rose was flanked by beautiful candles, a portrait of Our Lady of Guadalupe and an arrangement of roses. The rosary was said with each decade led by a different Knight. Lady Knight Sharon Cordona did the 1st reading. Deacon Shackley read the gospel and gave the homily which focused on respect for life and our continuing battle to abolish abortion. Upon completion of the prayer service, DGK Steven Monte' transferred the Silver Rose to Sir Knight Dave Polumbo – State Program Manager/Silver Rose. Holy Spirit Council #11548 was honored and privileged to have hosted the Silver Rose and we look forward to hosting her in 2023.

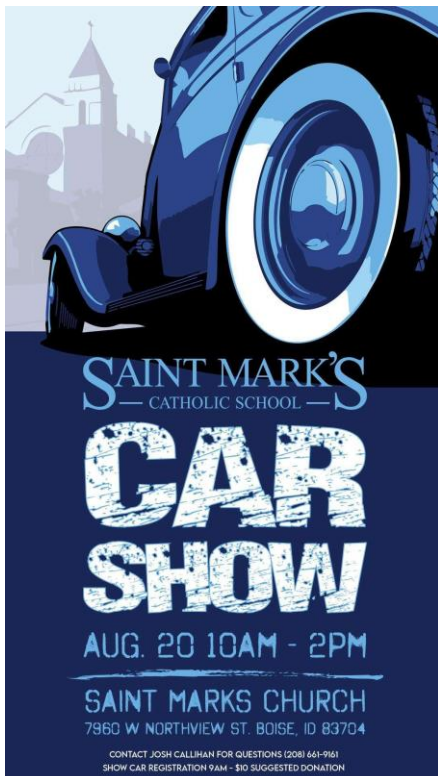
Bob Bauer Award

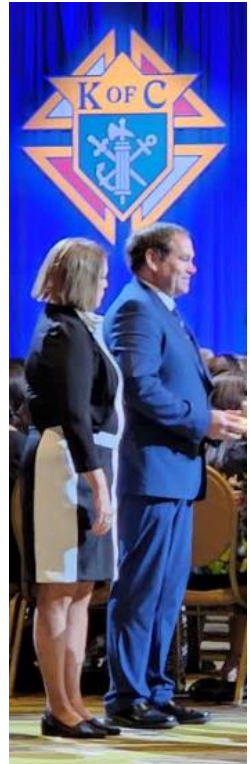
