




Scouts Honor

4th Degree - Buhl



Dear Brother Knights,

Great thanks to the members of both the Treasure Valley and Magic Valley Fourth Degree teams. We have successfully held two exemplifications in the last calendar month. The first was Hosted by Bishop Sylvester Treinen Assembly #2751 Meridian, ID. We had a wonderful Patriotic Degree that brought in fourteen new Sir Knights to three assemblies, three of which were priests. The dinner was wonderful, and they had a nice program in both social hour and at the dinner Banquet. The Second was hosted by my home Fr. Nicholas Wirtzberger Assembly #184. This Exemplification



brought in fifteen Sir Knights, thirteen in person and two online from four assemblies. Both host assemblies have exceeded their yearly membership quotas and are our states' largest assemblies.

Coincidence or the result of active recruiting to the Fourth Degree. I believe it is the latter. Please work to increase the percentage of Knights in the Fourth Degree. These members are usually more engaged with the Knights in both the Council and Assembly and have good retention. Nationally only 18.4% of Knights are Sir Knights, and Idaho is very close to that average. I would like to see that increased and possibly doubled. We stand at 37% of our intake Goal for the Fourth Degree in Idaho. We have a Fourth Degree Scheduled for Jan. 8 in Idaho Falls; information should be found in the flyer in this issue. An early Spring Degree in Lewiston is also being planned as well as a Spanish language Degree in Boise. Ask your active Third Degree members to join the Patriotic Degree.

Please start planning for the gathering of information for the #1728 Fraternal activity report that will be coming up in January. Sending the information gathering sheets for individuals with your dues statements will help get better response rates from your members.

- 2. The 1st Council to reach 100 % by June 30, 2022 gets \$150.00


Every new member MUST be recorded at supreme by close of business on March 30, 2022 to qualify!
