

Vice Supreme Master's Message

Worthy Sir Knights,

Membership: The new fraternal year and the new calendar year have similarities; in that we are asked to focus on membership. This focus is not just for new members but for your current members. If through the year we have not engaged our members to participate in anything meaningful, then they have little reason to ask others to join our ranks.

Navigators — Who are leaders of your neighboring Councils and Assemblys? Please reach out their Grand Knights and Faithful Navigators and talk about joint activities or events. Tell your District Masters what you are doing or ask them to assist you. Talk it up and share ideas. Are you anticipating an Exemplification, but are just not sure? Don't keep these thoughts to yourself because a shared thought or concern can flower into an event of wonder.

Another reminder for **Affiliate members**. If Councils move a member to Affiliate status, they are removed from the Fourth Degree roster until they choose to reestablish a Third Degree membership in good status.

Wear your colors: From your name plate to hats, ties, jacket, and everything in between. Let people especially other Knights know that you are a Fourth Degree Knight. Through your actions, others will want to join your ranks within the Patriotic Order of the Knights of Columbus.

Patriotism in the New Year: January 22 is Ukraine Day of Unity: Ukrainians join together to form a live chain across the Dnieper River in Kyiv to mark the 1919 Unification Act of the Ukrainian People's Republic and the short-lived West Ukrainian People's Republic. Many of us have been supporting Ukraine in both funds and prayers, we pray this celebration will still occur. If you feel moved to participate in a local celebration, please share it.

March 3 is National Anthem Day: We believe the United States adopted "The Star Spangled Banner" as its national anthem on this day. Francis Scott Key wrote his 1814 poem "Defence of Fort McHenry,". The song did not become the official anthem until 1931 when signed by President Herbert Hoover.

Planning - In preparation for our nation's Semiquincentennial in 2026 (the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence of the Thirteen Colonies in 1776). Big events take time to plan – start now.

Improper Regalia: Back in October, it was brought to the attention of Supreme that a new uniform (new regalia) from the Philippines could be made available if a member had a contact in that country. Maybe because of the tropical weather, I don't know the reasons, but the Philippines (PI) has a different uniform (regalia) than the rest of the Fourth Degree world. Their uniform is not transferable to any other country. If a Fourth Degree member transfers from the PI to Idaho (for example), they cannot wear the uniform brought over from the PI, so a new uniform must be purchased from www.kofcuniform.com/.

As far as uniforms go, only approved uniforms (regalia) are allowed to be worn. If someone has purchased similar color slacks or jacket or tie (I hope you get the idea), they are not authorized, and the member should be counseled so as not to bring discredit upon The Order.

Brother Sir Knights, as we begin our new year, I would like to remind you that the Knights of Columbus keep our Tax Exempt 501(c)8 Status by reporting our volunteer hours on the 1728 reports. Please go to the kofc.org website click "FOR MEMBERS" then "FORMS" and scroll down to find the 1728A individual work sheet and print out a copy for your Council and Assembly activities. Remember your hours of service to the church for lecturing, Eucharistic Minister, usher, religious education or service in any church ministries. There are other categories for helping the elderly and needy, blood drives visiting the bereaved or sick, working with youth or veterans. Fill out the form and send by e-mail or mail with dues, council hours to your Financial Secretary, and the assembly hours to the Faithful Comptroller by mid-January, so they can fill out the 1728 forms for Supreme due January 31. We greatly under report as typically only 30% members report and only a few of their many hours. Your assistance in gathering the information is greatly appreciated.

In addition, the new year is a time to reflect on our recruiting as we are half-way through the fraternal year. Please offer membership and give a Form 4 to the third-degree members that are regularly attending the meetings. We have an exemplification coming up on Saturday March 18th in Rupert, Idaho. This is going to be a bilingual exemplification as several candidates are from the Spanish language council in Burley. So, we would like to be able to read the applications of the candidates at our upcoming assembly meetings prior to the exemplification. A Fourth Degree Exemplification in Moscow, Idaho and Meridian are also in the planning stages for spring.

Have a happy new year! Bring up possibilities for Patriotic programing that your assembly could be involved with in your local communities. Active programming and activities such as dinners and picnics build camaraderie and purpose for your assembly. Remember if you are not meeting or have no purpose for the meetings then you will not retain your membership. 




Helping a Brother



K of C Cinnamon Roll Fundraiser Big Success at Holy Apostles

Holy Spirit Council #11548 has turned the shutdown of social events, because of Covid-19 at Holy Apostle church in 2020-2021, into very successful and well supported cinnamon roll sales in the courtyard. Normally pancake breakfasts would be held in the parish hall. The Council is scheduled to do six of these fundraisers a year, for long supported charities, which the parish is embracing with donations that greatly exceed the suggest retail price.







"We upped our production to 450 packages, from 350, and are running out before everyone is out of the church at the 9:00 and 11:00 AM masses," said GK David Cereghino. "Brother Dennis Kuntz came up with this program, and oversees the entire event, which includes buying the product; managing a Friday crew that gets the frozen rolls into tins for proofing; a Saturday early crew for baking them; another crew for icing them; and finally, crews to sell them at three of the masses. He does an outstanding job, and our charities really benefit."

"We list a retail of \$5, but average almost \$9, so our parish seems to like the rolls and ability to give us extra for our causes," said Brother Kuntz. "Problem we are having is demand, we can't make enough given the space and size of the kitchen to make everyone happy. Everyone enjoys a cinnamon roll. We might need a second shift!", he concluded.

The December FBO (For the Benefit Of) was held to support the church Jolly Project, which gifts to families in need for the holidays. Past events have sent large donations to the K of C Ukraine project; Corpus Christi House; Special Olympics; and Coats for Kids. Future FBO's are scheduled in February, March, and April, with one tied to the Bishop Sylvester Treinen #2751 efforts at the VA Hospital and Community Center.
