Family Director's Report

Food for Families - Council and parish families will raise funds to support their local food pantries, food banks and soup kitchens. For two program credits toward the Columbian Award – Collect a minimum of \$500 or 1,000 pounds of food for a parish or community food pantry and contribute a minimum of 100 total man-hours in preparation/distribution/service of meals. Report activity and apply for the refund using the Food for Families Refund and Plaque Application (#10057)

- At the end of the fraternal year, complete the Columbian Award Application (#SP-7). Immediately after your program is finished, complete the Food for Families Refund and Plaque Application (#10057) and the Fraternal Programs Report Form (#10784)
- Remember to provide proper documentation with form #10057, such as a donation receipt or letter from a food assistance organization detailing your donation. Applications will not be accepted and/or processed without supporting documentation. Submit completed application along with supporting documentation to fraternalmission@kofc.org
 - At the end of the fraternal year, complete the Columbian Award Application (#SP-7).






Worthy Sir Knights,

When it Rains It Pours Part 1 - Pocatello

On Tuesday, December 27th, a member of Pocatello Council 892 stopped in to the KC Chambers to make sure the Hall was in order with lights turned off and the doors locked. Well, it wasn't!

For an unknown length of time, and during which outside temperatures and wind chill factors were way below freezing and then a subsequent outside temperature increase, a water pipe broke in the recently remodeled gym foyer drinking fountain which allowed water to seep from the foyer into the KC Hall, gymnasium, and basement bathrooms. The plumber also determined a pipe broke in the basement in the area of the boiler room.

The Parish office was alerted to the situation and a restoration company was contacted to effect cleanup. The Parish insurance company was also contacted. Damages and possible repairs needed are not able to be assessed as yet but problems with the KC Hall carpet and kitchen flooring will no doubt need to be replaced. One item that will definitely be done is a heater to be installed in the foyer in order to make sure a pipe will not freeze up and break again.


For the time being the Parish suggests KC and CCW meetings, along with Parish and school activities, will not be held in the gym building until further notice.
