

My Brothers


It was great being with you for the men's conference, and meetings around the area. You all made me feel welcome and a part of the Knights in Idaho. I thank you for your questions and participation. Even the tough questions. My big message is Knights need Programs, but Programs need Knights. If Knights are not working, they get bored and wander away. We don't want this to happen. Always hold a variety of programs which will be interesting to a variety of men and their families. Some are interested in Faith, some Service. The Faith in Action book has a lot of ideas for you to put some spice into your council life.

Now without Knights, programs are simply a great idea which will go nowhere without someone to work them. We must ask men to join, or they will not. Men are waiting for the invitation, simply handing them a card or pamphlet is not enough. "Recruitment must be intentional it simply does not happen". A church drive is a great way to re-introduce your council to the parish. Remind them the works you have done and what is coming up. Invite every man in the parish to join. Too many times we hear "I always wanted to be a Knight, but no one ever asked me". ASK!

Remember to bundle the two together. At a program have a dedicated recruiter working the crowd looking for the guy who is waiting to be asked. At a recruiting event such as a church drive do a food drive or prayer program to kick off the weekend and involve your potential new member in a program right away.

Vice Supreme Master

Worthy Sir Knights,

Two big announcements in a row. Last month was about the new Colored Service Baldrics.

This month annouces the retirement of Supreme Master Dennis Stoddard.

During the Knights' Board of Directors quarterly meeting, they announced that Michael McCusker, the past state deputy of the Tennessee Knights of Columbus has been elected to serve as Supreme Master, leading the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus.

He served as state deputy of Tennessee from 2019-2021 and was elected to the Supreme Board of Directors during the Supreme Convention held in Nashville in August 2022. McCusker, a decorated military veteran, will succeed Dennis Stoddard, who will retire March 1 after 13 years as Supreme Master.



In recognition of Stoddard's distinguished record of accomplishments, the Board of Directors voted to accord him the honorary title of Supreme Master Emeritus.



I responded to the listing and received a phone call within a few hours. Miraculously, it was a brother of our council. Not only did our Brother move to offer it to us at zero cost he also provided expertise and most of the labor to install it in our home.
