Now is the time to make the final sprint to achieve all those awards you have set your sights on for your council to achieve. There are 50 days left to qualify. The State Council stands ready to help you, just ask.

I am firmly convinced that every Council in Idaho has already done enough to win the **Columbian Award**, if you are Safe Environment Compliant. All you must do is fill out the SP-7 application, have your DD or SD review it, make any modifications, and send it in. *9 Idaho Councils have already won the Columbian*.

You can win the **Founders Award** by inviting your Field Agent to do a Fraternal Benefits Event (FBE) at your council meeting, at a parish social, or online with Supreme's final videocast event. You just need 2 FBE's to win the Founders Award before June 30th. *15 Idaho Councils have already won the Founders*.

The **McGivney Award** only requires your council to reach their membership quota by exemplifying that number of new Knights, sending their info to MembershipRecords@kofc.org and having it accepted at Supreme before June 30th. 16 Idaho councils have already won the McGivney Award this year!

STAR Council requires you to win all three: Columbian, Founders, and McGivney, and be Safe Environment Compliant and to have turned in your Forms 1728 and 365 and have paid your dues. DOUBLE STAR has the same requirements except you bring in twice your membership quota. 7 Idaho councils have won STAR already! 1 Idaho Council has qualified for DOUBLE STAR! and two more are very close to making it.

Whatever you are striving for, if you need help attaining it, and you are ready to work for it, contact the Idaho State Council. *The State Council stands ready to help you*.

The SEC column shows the number of required positions you need to qualify Safe Environment Compliance. This must be 0 to win the Columbian Award. Ask your DD for which positions. Due 5/31.

Below is what the Supreme Council website says needs to be done for Family of the Month and Family of the Year. I got selected from my council in May 2014 and my winning nomination went to the State for a monthly prize with all councils in Idaho, and I won. Supreme returned with this Family Icon of the Holy Family. Another idea for awards like this is to post in the church bulletin. It's an easy award to do for a Knight's Family. Another program is the Knight of the Month / Year. Win at State level for either program and get a handshake by the State Deputy.

Family of the Month/Year - Each month, the council Family of the Month committee selects one parish family that models Christian family values and visibly lives them every day. Once a year, each participating council also selects one of the previous twelve Family of the Month winners to represent the council/parish as the potential international Family of the Year. For two program credits toward the Columbian Award – Recognizes Twelve Families throughout the fraternal year (one each month) and submit a Family of the Year to the jurisdiction.

- By the 15th day of the month following recognition, complete and submit the Family of the Month Report Form (#10668) and the Fraternal Programs Report Form (#10784). For example, the Report Forms for the September Family of the Month should be submitted by October 15.
- At the end of the fraternal year, complete the Columbian Award Application (#SP-7)

The 2022-2023 Idaho Knight of the Year

The 2022-2023 Idaho Knight of the Year is Max Nuxoll, Council 1024 Lewiston

Born November 8,1948 in Grangeville, Idaho to Ralph and Helen (Trukositz) Nuxoll.. One of 5 children (2 brothers & 2 sisters).. Parents went to church each Sunday and participated in parish and area parish events. Attended Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic School for 8 years. Graduated St Gertrude's Academy in Cottonwood, Idaho in 1966 operated by the Sisters of Saint Benedict (no he did not get his hands hacked with a ruler by the good sisters).. Blessed to have received excellent formation from my Catholic schooling. Graduated University of Idaho, BS Business Finance in 1971. Married to Joan (Snyder) Nuxoll from Kamiah, Idaho in July 1971 (51+ years). Joined the US Army in April 1972 completing 26 years of active duty and retiring in May 1998. Graduated from the University of Missouri, Kansas City with master's in public administration. Graduated from the Department of Defense Industrial College of the Armed Forces with master's in resource management. Parents of 6 children - 5 boys and 1 girl. Agreed to be foster parents while stationed in South Carolina and as a result one handicapped boy is adopted. Grandparents of 11. After military retirement moved to Cottonwood to work for his cousin as office manager for 13 years. Had a heart attack and expected to retire for good. Was hired by a local General Contractor and worked in the office doing computer work for another 5 years. Moved to Lewiston in 2019 to assist with ongoing support and care for adult son and family with 3 children who ended up having a bone marrow transport.

Joined KCs because of my father who did nothing to encourage him. Max's father was a Sir Knight in Grangeville, Idaho and a founding member of the Grangeville council 4058. As Max grew up, his father subscribed to the Columbia magazine each month and Max found it interesting enough to page through it.. His father's participation caused Max to be curious and he joined KCs in February 1992 (31 yrs ago) when stationed in Hawaii. Not active in KCs until after retirement and children were grown.. Family has the gift of service in that they like to help other people. His siblings are teachers and attorney. Three of his children are teachers and one is an attorney.

Knights service past and current: - 1389 Cottonwood Recorder, Guard, DGK x2 (4yrs), GKx2 (4 yrs) -Star Council during second time, DDx2 (6yrs) and DD of the year 1x when Brian Simer was State Deputy., Lector 6 yrs., 1st degree team member as GK with memorized part; assembled led, and participated in a 2nd degree team for the North Central Idaho councils; joined the 4th degree led the district's participation in the State Council Mideast Refugee Fundraiser.. While in Cottonwood started and led a men's group that met weekly (Paradisus Dei) and continued until moved to Lewiston in 2019. Participated weekly in a Cursillo men's 4th day group; started a roadside cleanup project for the council; started and led the council KC hoop shoot; initiated and chaired a wheel chair campaign; spoke at recruiting masses on Sunday at Mass twice yearly for 4-5 years; volunteered to chaperone youth to ICYC 7 consecutive years; assisted youth director on a 2 week mission trip to Mexico; then 2 more 2 week mission trips with the parish youth to Haiti; volunteered to ferry parish youth to activities countless times; initiated and led a Sunday night Bible study group for 10+ years; parish council member 2 years;; school release time member for 6 years; -wrote first ever release time operation manual from scratch and was nominated and received a diocesan award for that; led and ferried school release time volunteers to diocesan teacher trainings and set up a certification process with guidance from the diocese for them; participated in pancake breakfasts as a volunteer and as volunteer coordinator; participated in fundraisers for the council; initiated and led a week council project to paint the house exterior of a crippled member of the community.

1024 Lewiston-council community director and State Council community director.. Coordinated the Idaho State Council's Coats for Kids and the Lewiston Coats for Kids. Received a Supreme Award for the State for most funds donated to Wheelchair mission for Idaho's participation in 2021. Initiated, organized and led the council's Hoop Shoot participation 2 years; initiated and led the council's participation in the annual KC essay contest 2 years; participated in Lenten Fish Frys, hamburger feeds, breakfasts, and other activities. Initiated and led an annual blood drive for the 4th degree council for 2 years and is the Faithful Admiral for the Assembly. Volunteered to be a Red Cross Disaster Assistance Team member in 2021 and participated in over 20 disaster responses to dates. Joined the square dance club in the Lewis Clark Valley and with two left feet is learning how to be a square dancer. Volunteered to do taxes for the

AARP. Attends senior exercise fit and fall three times a week. Is a lector at Mass and goes to daily Mass. Participates in the local Cursillo 4th day group every week.

Reason he should be Knight of the Year - actions speak louder than words and Max is all about action, especially activities that serve his fellow man. He describes himself as being blessed and will always greet another with the remark "terrific" because he feels blessed by God and is inspired to share the incredible gift of life given by God. Max's life is truly exemplified by his KC Faith in Action which help men to live out their commitment to the Catholic faith and their desire to serve family, parish, and community. He demonstrates his faith through service and is a powerful example for his fellow members, the Idaho State Council, and all members of the order.

Mike has held almost every position within the Knights. Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight, Community Programs Director (current) and Chancellor. The entire family is involved in putting on our Easter Egg Hunt. They facilitate the collection of plastic eggs, gather them from Knights families and fill much more than the 2 dozen quota given to each knight to contribute. Mike coordinates the spreading out of eggs for the event during Easter Mass. Mike and many of the family members attend the Easter Vigil so they can be focused on putting on a great egg hunt on Easter morning for all the children in the parish.

Jill Schauble leads close to 150 children and volunteers in putting together our Vacation Bible School each year. It is truly a family affair with Grandma Val leading the craft room and sister Faith flying in from Texas for the week to lead the singing. All of the kids get involved in skits and being youth leaders, while little Mark still gets to enjoy the beauty of this amazing week of love, friendship and worship.

Grandma Val looked into becoming a cloistered Carmelite Nun but couldn't give up being full time Grandma so instead she studied for 2 years and became a Lay Carmelite. When most people would be enjoying retirement Grandma Val keeps finding ways to serve not just within her family but within the community. When the Knights were tasked with putting display tables together for the 75th anniversary of our Parish we knew that in order for the visual displays to look worthy of this significant event we would need Grandma Val's assistance. Your creativity and knack for showing the beauty of our church shown thru and we were extremely blessed for all of her hard work in making our parish history come to life.

Every person in the family contributes. The children are extremely active in Youth Ministry and the Right To Life movement. Little Mark is always there to pass out the collection basket. Program Title: Keep Christ in Christmas electronic billboard

Over the years there has been less attention to the real meaning of Christmas. The billboard was an effort by members of the four councils to counter that perception. The total cost for the billboard was \$1,100 for 30 days. The district is also considering an Easter message in the future.

The 2022-2023 Help the Disabled and Elderly

The 2022-2023 Help the Disabled and Elderly, Council 2014 Boise, Grand Knight Steven Green

Program Title: Health Equipment Loan Program (HELP) Center

The HELP Center provides medical equipment (i.e., walkers, wheelchairs, crutches, hospital beds, electrical scooters, bedside potty chairs, shower seats, canes, adult depends, ice cooler systems, etc.) free of charge. We collect, repair, and redistribute medical equipment/supplies to those who need it by loaning them whatever benefits them in their life circumstance. Donations are accepted, but not required. The all-volunteer force works to maintain/fix items, but also disassembles and recycles broken and unrepairable items. The Center is open twice a week, every week for people to sign-out or drop off items.

This program benefits the entire Treasure Valley community by providing healthcare support. Many customers are injured, disabled, and/or elderly and benefit from the no-cost option of the Center. Local hospitals contact the Center and recommend patients to stop by to receive free equipment/support. The HELP Center even reaches beyond the borders of the United States, as the Center teamed up with Hands of Hope Northwest to fill three shipping containers full of medical equipment for those injured and disabled by the war in Ukraine. Hands of Hope estimated the total value of equipment in those three shipments at \$933,000.

The need for this program is huge and the problem is the cost of medical equipment on the market. The HELP Center sees over 1200 people annually who are in need of medical equipment for themselves or family members, but often times, cannot afford it. The HELP Center resolves the problem by offering these items free of charge. A brand-new ice system or wheelchair can cost more than \$200; they are free from us. Electric wheelchairs are thousands of dollars; they are free at the HELP Center. The Center fills the need (both medically and financially) by offering medical items for whoever requires them. Furthermore, those disabled/injured in war-torn Ukraine are in desperate need of any supplies/equipment we can get to them.

This program has been in place for decades, but it is being highlighted this year because it has seen enormous growth and use since COVID. The number of people who have used this program is staggering and shows it must continue to operate. The Council supports this program by staffing it with an all-volunteer force, cleaning out old supplies, recycling unusable items, and being compassionate and friendly to all who walk through the doors. Operating this program demonstrates to the community that the Knights have a wide scope of outreach, and in this case, specifically helps the disabled, elderly, and vulnerable in our society.

In addition to the 1200+ people who walk through the HELP Center's doors each year looking for assistance and free access to medical equipment, the Center also provides an email and phone service.



116th Idaho State Convention

The 116th State of Idaho Knights of Columbus Convention was held on April 14th through 16th in Coeur d'Alene. It was hosted by the St. Pius X Council 11623. The Convention's purpose is to celebrate this year's accomplishments, plan the remainder of the fraternal year ending June 30, and prepare for the future guided by the Order's principles of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity. About 100 Knights and 40 spouses from across the state attended and while much business was accomplished, much fun was had. This year's theme was "Good men doing God's work."

Historical accomplishments were made this year:

- Governor Little made an official proclamation that April 10-16 was Knights of Columbus Week.
- A partnership of Salt & Light Radio and the Idaho Knights of Columbus is being forged.
- In a first, we livestreamed an Exemplification on YouTube, 6 new men became Knights.
- Another first, we held the first Fraternal Benefits Event at a state convention and livestreamed it too.
- Idaho reached 100% of its membership growth goal on March1, the earliest ever for our state.
- Sixteen local Idaho councils or 40% have reached 100% of their growth goal.
- Six of our councils have achieved the rare STAR council award. One council is close to TRIPLE STAR.
- We voted \$2000 to the GoFundMe page for the family of Fr. Gabriel, who is hospitalized.
- The winner of Idaho's first ever State Charity Raffle is Don Atha, Grand Knight of Our Lady of the Rosary Council 10581 in Boise.

After registration of delegates and Mass, Friday's meetings were held at St. Pius X church in the Great Room. Our Convention Business meetings all open with prayer, which is generally a decade of the rosary, a pledge of allegiance, and roll call of officers. Primarily we cover rules of conduct, greetings from visiting dignitaries, and assignment of delegates to various convention committees, such as credentials, election clerks, and audit. We close with meetings with another decade of the rosary.

Saturday's and Sunday's meetings were held in the Best Western Plus Coeur d'Alene Inn. After the 8am Holy Hour and addresses by the Supreme Knight, Patrick Kelly, and State Deputy, George Mesina, our spouses left for the Ladies Program. Spouses were taken to the Coeur d'Alene's Old Mission State Park in Cataldo, The trip was organized

by Warren and Theresa Holcomb of Council 11623. The Sacred Heart Mission is the oldest building in Idaho. In the 1850's Jesuit missionaries found that members of the Coeur d'Alene Tribe had been prepared by the Holy Spirit to receive spiritual wisdom from men in black robes. The park rangers took the ladies on a tour of the Mission and the surrounding area. The ladies prayed the rosary in the Mission. Afterwards, the ladies were taken to the historic Snake Pit restaurant in Enaxille.

Saturday's business meetings involved reports on various aspects the status of the state, speeches by charities that work with the knights, Mass, and an Awards Banquet. Sunday primarily involves voting on new officers, resolutions and



delegates to the Supreme Convention, and the budget. We have a lot of fun fining ourselves \$1 for misspeaking and other protocol errors, but in the end all the fine money and more are donated to charity.


